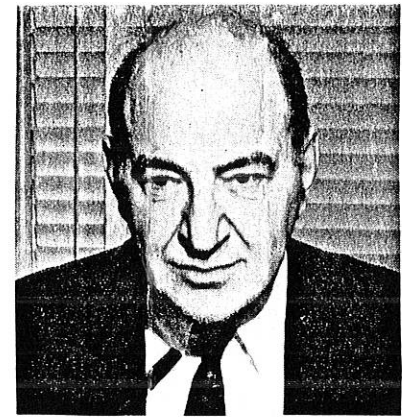

This course is designed to aid the serious student of liberty in understanding the ideas and history behind the concept of freedom.

There were many important changes that occurred in the libertarian movement from the beginning of the twentieth century to the current period.

At the turn of the century, libertarians of all stripes were considered leftists. Since then, libertarianism has generally been viewed as part of the right wing of the American political schemata. Why the change? When did the left-right flip-flop occur, and what factors led to this change?

What happened to the dominant libertarian political wing, the Georgists, and what implications does this have for us today. Who were the Christian Libertarians? What were the major organizations and issues for the libertarian movement during the 40's and 50's? What was Ayn Rand's role in the growth of the libertarian movement in the 60's? What was the "Austrian" impact on the libertarian movement?

These and other issues will be dealt with in this course.

War comes to libertarianism, the old right joins with libertarians, LaFollette to the rescue, FEE and the beginning of Christian Libertarianism, Von Mises and the Austrian School.

Christian Libertarianism flowers--R.C. Hoiles, Christian Economics, Spiritual Mobe, Spencer Heath, The Institute for Humane Studies; the new libertarian radicals--Robert LeFevre and the Freedom School (Rampart College), the Breath of Reason--Ayn Rand and NBI, Murray Rothbard.

Sunday Dec. 5, 1982 12:30-2:30

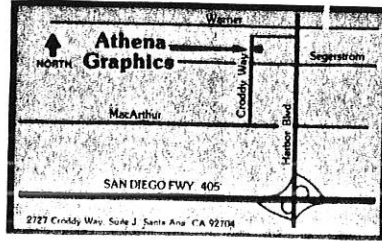
